## TOWN OF LINCOLN NOTICE PROPOSED PROPERTY TAX RATE CHANGE

The Town of Lincoln proposes to increase its property tax levy to \$54,469,436 in the 2021-2022 budget year; the property tax levy this year is \$53,826,621. The FY 2021 and FY 2022 tax levies have excluded motor vehicle excise tax for the purpose of determining tax levy growth pursuant to current law. THIS IS A PROPOSED INCREASE OF 1.19%.

It is anticipated that there will be an overall increase in property values and when coupled with the increase in the proposed tax levy will result in a property tax rate of \$20.26 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for residential real estate, \$25.18 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for commercial real estate and \$31.97 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for tangible personal property, as compared to the current property tax rates of \$20.14 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for residential real estate, \$25.03 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for commercial real estate and \$31.78 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for tangible personal property.

The preliminary FY 2021-2022 motor vehicle levy includes taxes on motor vehicles at a reduced rate of \$30.00 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, which includes the exemption amount provided by the state's motor vehicle excise tax phase-out legislation for an exemption up to \$5,000 as compared to the current motor vehicle tax rate of \$30.66 which includes an exemption of \$4,000.

Property tax rates of \$20.83 for residential real estate, \$25.88 for commercial real estate and \$32.86 for tangible personal property would be needed in the coming budget year to raise the maximum levy authorized by Section 44-5-2 of the Rhode Island General Laws.

The Annual Financial Town Meeting is tentatively scheduled for Monday, June 21, 2021 at 7:00 pm at the Lincoln High School Auditorium, having been rescheduled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The above property tax estimates have been computed in a manner approved by the Rhode Island Department of Revenue.
